The Evaluation and Management (E/M) documentation guidelines for new and established patient visits are changing effective January 1, 2021

That means big changes are ahead in the coding, documentation and payment of these evaluation-and-management services. There is a lot for physician practices (clinicians and billing personnel) to understand before the new E/M office visit guidelines take effect Jan. 1, 2021. Among the 2021 changes for E/M office visits are: Eliminating history and physical exam as elements for code selection. This will allow physicians to choose the best patient care by permitting code level selection based on medical decision-making (MDM) or total time. In addition, learn about coding for therapy, substance use disorders, telehealth/telepsychiatry and more.
